

- For example, the Cottons 40°C programme has a longer running time than the Cottons 40°C or 60°C programme, but the Cottons 40°C programme is more efficient in terms of energy and water consumption.
- To get the most out of your machine, load the maximum dry load for the programme you are using.
- Use the *Express 20* programme for small, lightly soiled loads.
