Getting Started

Cable Installation

Before the installation and use, please read carefully the relevant content in "Warning and Safety instructions".

Take out the TV from the wrapping package and put it in a drafty and flat place.

NOTE:

- When you plug or unplug the power cable, you must make sure that the TV, computer or other equipment have been already shut down.
- ◆ When unplugging the power cable or signal cable, please hold the plug (the insulated part); do not draw the body of the cable.
- LAN: Use a network cable to connect the interface and the broadband network interface.
- HDMI: (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) it provides an uncompressed digital connection that carries both video and audio data by way of an integrated mini-plug cable.

NOTE:

- While connecting the HDMI, please aim at carefully, do not insert overexerted, for fear the pin might be broken.
- ANT: Connect the antenna to TV via coaxial cable on ANT jack of the back panel.
- DIGITAL AUDIO OUT: Send the TV's audio signal to external audio equipment via the Digital Audio Output port.
- **HEAD PHONE** (∩): Connect a 3.5mm headphone for personal audio.
- **USB2.0**: Connect a USB Storage device and multimedia file playback.
- PC: Connect one end of the VGA cable with the VGA port on computer, connect the other end of the VGA cable with the VGA port on the TV, and tighten the bolts clockwise on the each end of VGA cable.
- COMPONENT input (YPbPr): Connect a device that has component video jacks, such as a DVD player.
- Y/Pb/Pr (Component Video): They provide good picture quality because the video signal is separated into three components. Use three video-grade or component video cables for the connection. When using Y/Pb/Pr, make sure you connect left and right audio cables to the R-AUDIO-L jacks.

 • AV OUT: The monitoring signal output of the TV set can be used as the signal source.
- ◆ If AV works as mini terminal, please choose to use a one-to-three audio & video cable.

NOTE:

- ◆ The range of power input for the TV is 100-240V~ 50/60Hz; do not connect the TV power input port with the power cable out of the above range.
- ◆ Please hold the insulated part of the plug when you are unplugging the power cable, do not touch directly the metallic part of the cable.
- Before connecting to an external device, please firstly make sure that the TV set and the external device have been turned off. When connecting, please make reference to the interface name and the interface color to connect the signal cable.
- The unit has a built-in wireless network card, and can directly receive network signals from wireless router through WIFI antenna.

Getting Started

Using the Remote Control

When using the remote control, aim it at remote sensor on the television. If there is an object between the remote control and the remote sensor on the unit, the unit may not operate.

- Point the remote control at the REMOTE SENSOR located on the television.
- When using this television in a very brightly lit area, the infrared REMOTE CONTROL SENSOR may not work properly.
- The recommended effective distance for using the remote control is about 7 metres.

Installing Batteries in the Remote Control

- Open the cover at the back of the remote control.
- Install two AAA size batteries. Make sure to match the "+" and "-" ends of the batteries with the diagram inside the compartment.

Battery Replacement

You will need to install the batteries into the remote control to make it operate following the instruction below.

When the batteries become weak, the operating distance of the remote control will be greatly reduced and you will need to replace the batteries.

Notes on Using Batteries:

The use of the wrong type of batteries may cause chemical leakage and/or explosion. Please note the following:


- Always ensure that the batteries are inserted with the + and terminals in the correct direction as shown in the battery compartment.
- Different types of batteries have different characteristics. Do not mix different types.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries will shorten battery life and/or cause chemical leakage.
- Replace batteries as soon as they do not work.
- Chemicals which leak from batteries may cause skin irritation. If any chemical matter seeps out of the batteries, wipe it up immediately with a dry cloth.
- The batteries may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions. Remove
 the batteries whenever you anticipate that the remote control will not be used for an
 extended period.
- The batteries (battery pack or batteries installed) shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

CAUTION:

- It may result in an explosion if batteries are replaced incorrectly.
- Only replace batteries with the same or equivalent type.



- 20. NETFLIX: Goes to NETFLIX homepage.

Basic Operation

Turning on and off the TV

Turn on the TV

Plug the power cord into a suitable power point, then press the **POWER** (**b**) button, on the lower side of the back panel (or on the remote control, making sure to aim it at the sensor at the front of the TV);

Turn off the TV

Press the σ button on the remote control to enter standby mode. To power down the TV completely, unplugs the power cord from the mains socket.

Do not leave your set in standby mode for long periods of time. If you will not use the TV for a long time, it is recommended to unplug the set from the mains and aerial.

First Time Setup

If this is the first time you run the TV, the Initial Setup Menu will appear in the picture, and the items of this menu also exist in other menus, so you are able to change the values after you set them up.

Tips: Make sure that the antenna or cable TV system connection is made.

Set you desired language

Press the ▲/▼ buttons to select the Menu Language, and then press the **OK** button. Press the ► button to go to the next step.

• End-User License Agreement

Select **Accept** and then press the ▶ button to accept the EULA and go to the next step.

Select **View additional details** and then press the **OK** button to read a detailed EULA.

Press the ◀ button to go to previous step.

Select your country

Press the ▲/▼ buttons to select the country you are living in, and then press the **OK** button.

Press the ▶ button to go to the next step. Press the ◀ button to go to previous step.

Select your time zone

Press the ▲/▼ buttons to select a time zone, and then press the **OK** button.

Press the ▶ button to go to the next step. Press the ◀ button to go to previous step.

Select your TV environment

Press the ▲/▼ buttons to select the Home Mode or Store Mode and then press the OK button.

• Home is the recommended setting to produce the best energy efficiency. If you want to set Store Mode, a message appears asking you to confirm your choice.

Press the ▶ button to go to the next step. Press the ◀ button to go to previous step.

Network connection (Wired or WIFI)

Press the ▲/▼ buttons to select "Wired" or "Wifi", and wired or wireless network is enabled respectively. (For more details on connection, please refer to the "Network settings".)

Select "Skip" and press OK to cancel the network setup and move to next step.

Basic Operation

Select the antenna type

Press the $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ buttons to select the tuning modes and then press the **OK** button. (For more detailed information, please refer to Channel menu \rightarrow Auto Tuning). Press the \blacktriangleright button to go to the next step. Press the \blacktriangleleft button to go to previous step.

The TV starts Auto Tuning.

NOTE:

- ◆ If the TV doesn't receive any channels, please check your aerial connection or the country you selected, and then try an auto search again.
- ◆ If the TV just receives some of the channels, it means the aerial's reception isn't good enough and an antenna service is recommended.

Programme Selection

• Using the $\land \land \lor$ on the panel of TV or $\land P \lor$ on the remote control.

Press **P** ∧ to increase channel number.

Press **P** ∨ to decrease channel number.

• Using 0-9 Digital Buttons.

You can select the channel number by pressing 0 to 9. Example:

To select - channel (e.g. Channel 5): Press 5.

To select -- channel (e.g. Channel 20): Press 2 and 0 in a short time.

Volume Adjustment

Changing the Input Source

- 1. You can select the input source by pressing the **SOURCE (企)** button on the remote control.
- Press the arrow button to cycle through the input source, and press the OK button to confirm your choice.


How to Navigate Menus

Before using the TV follow the steps below to learn how to navigate the menu in order to select and adjust different functions. The access step may differ depending on the selected menu.

- 1. Press the **MENU** (*) button to display the main menu.
- 2. Press the ▲/▼ button to select the desired sub item.
- Press the OK or ▶ button to access the menu of the next level.
- **4.** Press the **BACK**(♦) button to return to the previous menu.
- 5. Press the **EXIT** (→) button exit from the menu.

NOTE:

- ◆ When an item in MENU is displayed gray, it means that the item is not available or cannot be adjusted.
- Buttons on the TV have the same function as corresponding buttons on the remote control. If your remote control is lost or couldn't work, you may use the buttons on the TV to select menus. This manual focuses on operation of the remote control.
- Some items in the menus may be hidden depending on modes or signal sources used.
- ◆ TV's OSD (On Screen Display) may differ slightly from that shown in this manual.



Configuring the Channel Menu

- Auto tuning: Press the OK button to enter sub-menu.
 - Tune Type: Press the ▲/▼ button to select tune type: DTV+ATV, DTV, ATV.
 - Country: Press the ▲/▼ button to select country.
 - **Service Type:** Select the service type to search.
 - LCN: Select the LCN functions On or Off.
 - Search: Press the OK/► button to start the auto searching.

Once the progress bar is full, the found channels will be stored and the unit will proceed to the search for DTV, ATV. Radio and Data.

If the tune type is DTV+ATV, you can press the **MENU** (**②**) button in TV searching.

the Auto Tuning will skip to ATV searching as the suggestive picture shows.

- DTV Manual Tuning: Manual store for digital channels.
 - 1. Press the **◄/▶** button to select channel, Scan Mode and Service Type.
 - 2. Press the Select button to start channel tuning. When a channel is found, the searching process will stop; the channel will be saved with current channel number. Press the **EXIT** () button to exit.
- ATV Manual Tuning: Manual store for ATV channels.
 - Press the ▲/▼ button to select items.
 - 2. Press the
 √> button to adjust it.
 - **3.** When setting is completed, Press the ▼ button to select "SAVE" to save it.
- Dynamic Rescan: Switch the Dynamic Rescan function On or Off

■ Channel Edit

Press the ▲/▼ buttons select the Channel Edit, then press the **OK** button to enter sub-menu.

- 1. Press the **△**/**▼** button to select a channel.
- Press the ◄/► button to select the following or preceding page.
- Delete: Press the RED button to delete the channel.

Favourite: Press the **Green** button to set the favorite channel.

Move: Press the **YELLOW** button to set the channel to moving state, and then press the **△**/▼buttons to move it to the position you want to put.











Skip: Press the **BLUE** button to skip the channel. (Your TV set will skip the channel automatically when using $\land P \checkmark$ to view the channels.)

• Signal Information (In DTV mode): Display the current Signal Information.

Configuring the Picture Menu

- Picture Mode: You can select the type of picture which best corresponds to your viewing requirements. Contrast, Brightness, Color, Sharpness, Tint (NTSC) and Backlight can be adjusted when the picture mode is set to User.
 - **Contrast:** Adjust the white level of the picture.
 - Brightness: Adjust darkness of black sections in the picture.
 - **Color:** Adjust the color intensity of the picture.
 - Sharpness: Object edges are enhanced for picture detail.
 - Tint: Adjust the hue of the picture. (Valid only for NTSC signals).
 - Backlight: To control the brightness of the screen, adjust the brightness of panel.
- Coloi r Temperature: Select the color temperature of the picture.
- Aspect Ratio: You can select the picture size which best corresponds to your viewing requirements.
- Noise Reduction: Reduces screen noise without compromising video quality.
- Screen (Valid only in the VGA channel)
 - Auto Adjust: To adjust the all PC setting automatically.
 - Horizontal Pos.: To adjust the horizontal placing of the image.
 - Vertical Pos.: To adjust the vertical placing of the image.
 - Size: To adjust the screen size.
 - Phase: To adjust the internal signal phase.
- Advance Settings: Use the ▲/▼ button to select Expert Settings, and then press
 OK button to access the submenu page.

MPEG NR: Reduces MPEG noise to provide improved picture quality.

Dynamic Contrast: Adjusts the contrast to the optimal level according to the image's brightness.

Film Mode: Sets the TV so that it senses and then processes film signals from all sources automatically and adjusts the picture for optimum quality.

PC Mode (In HDMI mode): When it is set to "On", the TV set is more suitable to be used as a monitor (valid only in the VESA mode of the HDMI channel).

Overgcan (In DTV mode): The picture reproduction rate is adjusted.

Picture Reset: Reset all picture settings to the factory defaults.



Configuring the Sound Menu

- Sound Mode: You can select a sound mode to suit your personal preferences.
 Seven-stage equalization sound can be adjusted when the sound mode is set to User.
 - Surround Sound: Press ▲/▼ buttons to select Surround Sound, you can select Off, Low, Middle, and High.
 - Dialog Enhancer: Press ▲/▼ buttons to select Dialog Enhancer, you can select Off, Low, Middle, and High. The dialogue enhancer feature allows you to clearly hear the dialogue voice of the TV broadcast, thus avoiding the background sound effects being too loud and the dialogue voice being too small.
 - AVC (Auto Volume Control): Press ▲/▼ buttons to select Auto Volume Control, you can select Off, Low, Middle, and High.
 - Seven-stage equalization setting: Press the

 3 KHz, 6 KHz or 12 KHZ, and then press the ◀/▶ buttons to adjust the frequency
- Balance: You can adjust the sound balance of the speakers to preferred levels.


- S/PDIF Mode: Press ◀/▶ buttons to select SPDIF Type. You can select "PCM" or "Auto". SPDIF (Sony Philips Digital Interface) provides digital audio output to speakers and various digital devices such as A/V Receivers and Home Theaters which reduces interference and distortion.
- AD Switch (In DTV mode) *this is only available in some countries, mainly in North America and Europe. This is an auxiliary audio function that provides an additional audio track for visually challenged persons. This function handles the Audio Stream for the AD (Audio Description), when it is sent along with the Main audio from the broadcaster. Users can turn the Audio Description On or Off and control the volume.
- AD Volume: When the AD Switch is set On, the AD Volume can be adjusted.
- Audio Delay: Press the ▲/▼ buttons select the Audio Delay, then press the
 OK button to enter sub menu. You can select "SPDIF Delay" or "Speaker Delay".
 Correct audio-video sync problems, when watching DTV and when listening to
 digital audio output using an external device such as an audio receiver
 (0ms~250ms).
- Sound Reset: Reset all sound settings to the factory defaults.




Network Function Operation Instruction

You can set up your TV so that it can access the Internet through your local area network (LAN) using a wired or wireless connection.


- ☐ Connecting to a Wired Network
 - You can attach your TV to your LAN using cable in three ways:
 You can attach your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to an external modem using a Cat 5 cable. See the diagram below.



 You can attach your TV to your LAN by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to an IP Sharer which is connected to an external modem. Use Cat 5 cable for the connection. See the diagram below.



Depending on how your network is configured, you may be able to attach your TV
to your LAN by connecting the LAN by port on the back of your TV directly to a
network wall outlet using a Cat 5 cable. See the diagram below. Note that the wall
outlet is attached to a modem or router elsewhere in your house.



If you have a Dynamic Network, you should use an ADSL modem or router that supports Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP). Modems and routers that support DHCP automatically provide the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS values your TV needs to access the Internet so you don't have to enter them manually. Most home networks are Dynamic Networks. Some networks require a Static IP address. If your network requires a Static IP address, you must enter the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS values manually on your TV's Cable Setup Screen when you set up the network connection. To get the IP address, subnet mask, gateway and DNS values, contact your Internet Service Provider (ISP). If you have a Windows computer, you can also get these values through your computer.

Wired Network Setup

- How to set up automatically (Wired)

Use the Automatic Network Setup when connecting your TV to a network that supports DHCP.

- 1. Connect your TV to your LAN as described in the previous section.
- Turn on your TV, press the MENU (☼) button on your remote, use the ▲/▼
 buttons to select Network.
- Press the OK or ➤ button to enter. Then press the ▲/▼ button to select Wired.
- **4.** Select **IPv4** or **IPv6**. Then press the **OK** button to enter the menu of the next level.
- 5. Set Network Config. to DHCP.
- **6.** Auto acquires and enters the needed Internet values automatically.
- Select the Connect and press OK to connect the internet
- 8. If the Network Function has not acquired the network connection values, please manually input configuration information.

- How to set up manually (Wired)

Use the Manual Network Setup when connecting your TV to a network that requires a Static IP address.

- 1. Follow Steps 1 through 4 in the "How to set up automatically" procedure.
- 2. Set Network Config. to Manual.
- Press the ▲/▼ button to highlight the field you want to change, and then use the number buttons to input the network parameters, such as IP Address, Subnet Mask, Gateway and DNS. Press BACK(⁻) key to return.
- **4.** When done, select the **Connect** and press **OK** to connect the internet.

NOTE:


If you manually set the IP address, you must not use the same IP address for any other device. The IP address you use should be a private address.

Tips for Network Connection:

- Use a standard LAN cable with this TV. Cat5 or better with a RJ45 connector.
- Many network connection problems during set up can often be fixed by re-setting
 the router or modem. After connecting the player to the home network, quickly
 power off and/or disconnect the power cable of the home network router or cable
 modem. Then power on and/or connect the power cable again.

☐ Connecting to a Wireless Network

You can connect your TV to your LAN through a standard wireless router or modem.



Wireless Network Configuration

Most wireless network systems incorporate a security system that requires devices that access the network through an access point or wireless router (typically a wireless IP Sharer) to transmit an encrypted security code called an access key.

Wireless Network Setup

- How to set up Wifi
 - Turn on your TV, press the MENU (☼) button on your remote, use the ▲/▼ buttons to select Network, and then press the OK or ► button to enter Connection Type.
 - Press the ▲/▼ button to select Wifi. Then press the OK button to enter the menu of the next level.
 - 3. The Network function searches for available wireless networks. When done, it displays a list of the available networks. In the list of networks, press the ▲/▼ button to select a network, and then press the OK button.
 - **4.** On the Please Enter screen, enter your network's Password. To enter the Password, follow these general directions:

Press the **OK** button to display the keyboard at the screen.

Use the direction buttons to select a letter, special symbols or number, move to the letter, special symbols or number, and then press the **OK** button.

To delete the last letter or number you entered, Use the direction buttons to select and press **OK**. Press **EXIT** ((-)) to close the keyboard.

- Input the correct Password and select the Connect and press the OK button to connect the network.
- Add: You can also add a WiFi network manually by selecting Add others.

 Press ▲/▼buttons to select Add, then press OK button, follow the displayed messages below the menu to input the network name, encryption mode and network password, and then press ▲/▼buttons to select "Connect", the system starts to search wireless routing and connect. When the network is connected, the current wireless network will be added into the list of wireless networks.
- WOW: Switch the WOW on or off.

☐ If Your TV Fails to Connect to the Internet:

- Your TV may not be able to connect to the Internet because your ISP has
 permanently registered the MAC address (a unique identifying number) of your PC
 or modem, which it then authenticates each time you connect to the Internet as a
 way of preventing unauthorized access. As your TV has a different MAC address,
 your ISP can not authenticate its MAC address, and your TV can not connect.
- To resolve this problem, ask your ISP about the procedures required to connect devices other than a PC (such as your TV) to the Internet.
- If your Internet service provider requires an ID or password to connect to the Internet, your TV may not be able to connect to the Internet.
- The internet connection may fail because of a firewall problem. If this is the case, contact your Internet service provider.

Configuring the System Menu

- Language: Select your preferred On Screen Display language.
- Subtitle: Switch the Subtitle function on or off.
- Subtitle Hearing Impaired: When hearing Impaired is ON, the TV screen will give some information to the people whose hearing are impaired when Hearing Impaired is Off. the information will be hidden.
- Audio Languages: Select you're preferred audio language. (Available for digital channels if multiple audio languages are broadcasted.)
- Subtitle Languages: Select your preferred subtitle Language. (Available for digital channels if multiple subtitle languages are broadcasted.)
- HBBTV: Switch the HBBTV function On or Off.

- ◆ This service may be supported in other countries.

- An application on HBBTV may malfunction temporarily depending on the circumstances of the broadcast station or application provider.

□ Recording

- Instant Recording

● Select the channel you want, then press ●(RECORD) button on the remote control to start recording. A menu will come up on the screen when TV start recording.



- Press (RECORD) button to minimize the information bar at the bottom of the screen. Press (RECORD) button again to display information about the current recording.
- Press the (STOP) button display a dialogue box: select "Yes" to stop recording, select "No" to dismiss the dialogue box.

The unit is able to do schedule recording when TV is turned on or in standby mode.

☐ Time Shift Function

If an USB device dedicated to recording is disconnected, Time Shift files that were saved will automatically be deleted.

When using the PVR/Media function, remember the following important points:

- ◆ You should use a USB disk with at least 4GB capacity.
- ◆ The connected USB device must support 2.0 speeds.
- We strongly recommend you back up all data in the USB storage device o another storage device so you do not risk losing any data in case of an unexpected device failure or accident. We do not assume liability for any loss of data due to misuse or malfunction. Data backup is your personal responsibility.
- ◆ You cannot change to a channel from another broadcaster or select another function while in recording mode.
- If the signal is interrupted or removed while in recording mode, the recording will stop until the signal is established. This may cause you to lose program content.
- ◆ Some USB storage devices may not be compatible for smooth operation with this TV.

- For large file sizes and large capacity storage devices, the loading speed may be longer. The recognition speed of a USB storage device may vary depending on the device.
- When connecting or disconnecting the USB storage device, ensure the TV is not in USB mode, otherwise the USB device or the files stored in it may be damaged.





- Auto Sleep: Select the Auto Sleep time you want. The TV will enter into standby mode automatically when there is no operation in set time.
- No Signal Power Off: When set to "On", if there's no TV signal nor press-button operation, TV will enter standby status automatically about 5 minutes later.

Press **EPG** button to display the Programme Guide menu. This function let you know the detailed information of the channel, indicating the time of the program playing. From the PROGRAMME GUIDE it is possible to check the program information for the next eight days (If the information is available from the broadcaster). Press **EXIT** (button to exit.

Channel: Press the green button to display the Channel list

Record: Press red button to set the parameters for recording. The unit is able to do schedule recording when TV is turning on or in standby mode. You can set up several schedule recording. Different schedules should not overlap. When recording starts in standby mode, the front indicators will change color and there will be no picture or sound from the unit.



When playing any file and there is no menu display, press the **OK** key to display the play console, press the up key to select the control button repeatedly, and press the **OK** key to perform the functions of the selected key. To close the play console, please press the **BACK** (♦) key.

- 1. Stop: Stop play the video.
- 2. Setting: To enter the video play setting menu.
- 3. Info: Video file information.
- 4. Prev: To play the previous file in the same directory.
- 5. Next: To play the next file in the same directory.
- 6. Play Mode: Select the different play mode.

Applications



Press **SOURCE** () button on the remote to display the home main interface. Then use the Arrow buttons to select the desired APP and press **OK** button to view. Or press the hotkey on the remote control to enter the desired APP directly.

■ Netflix

Sign in to your Netflix® account to browse by genre, search for titles, manage your Instant Queue and review Netflix® recommendations all from you TV. If you do not have a Netflix® account, you will need to create a new account to use this feature. Watch TV show and movies online or by streaming them from Netflix. NOTE:

- The videos list searched from the TV may different with the list searched from a web browser on PC.
- The playback videos may be paused, stopped or buffering occurring often depending on your broadband speed. We recommend a minimum connection speed of 1.5 Mbps.
 For the best playback condition, a connection speed of 4.0 Mbps is required.
- These services are provided by separate Content Provider. Please visit the content providers web site for specific information on their services.
- For service that requires log in, join the applicable service on the website using the PC and log in through the TV to enjoy various additional functionalities.

■ Multiscreen

- "Multiscreen" it is a mirror technology. You can make Smart TV display same pictures displayed on android device in the same wireless network.
- To start using Multiscreen feature, go to home page and press **OK** on "Multiscreen".
- Turn on Wireless Display (a.k.a. Wi-Fi Display, Wi-Fi Direct or Cast Screen) function on your smart phone or tablet (Please refer to your device's user manual for information on how to turn on wireless display).
- Your mobile device will display a list of available devices. Choose 'TV name' click on it to connect.
- Your mobile device will connect to the TV and will display the device screen on the TV.

NOTE: Your TV and Smartphone must be connected to the same wireless network with this application. Some Android devices may not support this function. (The iOS devices is not supported).

Teletext

Using the teletext feature

Display teletext

- 1. Select a TV station with a teletext signal.
- 2. Press the button to enter teletext mode.
- **3.** Press the button to enter Mix mode, this function enables you to superimpose the teletext page over the TV program.
- **4.** Press the button 2nd return or exit to the normal ATV/DTV mode.

Page selection

- 1. Enter the page number (three digits) using the number buttons. If you press a wrong number during input, you must complete the three digit number and then reenter the correct page number.
- 2. The ▲/▼ button can be used to select the preceding or following page.

Hold

You can press the button to hold a page, and press it again to release the page.

Index

Press the button to enter the main index page directly.

Enlarging Text

When a page is displayed, you can double the size of the text to make it easier to read.

- 1. Press the button to enlarge the top half of the page.
- 2. Press the button again to enlarge the bottom half of the page.
- 3. Press the button once more to return to the normal display.

Reveal mode

You can display concealed teletext information (e.g. Answer to puzzles or riddles etc.) by pressing button. Press button again to remove the information from the display.

Subpage

Some teletext may contain several sub-pages which are automatically paged in a certain cycle by the TV station.

- 1. You can enter into a certain sub page by pressing the button directly and select the page number with number buttons. Enter the sub page number (e.g. 0003) for the third sub page.
- 2. Press the button again to exit the sub page mode.
- 3. Press the button to return to the normal TV mode.

Color buttons (Red, Green, Yellow and blue)

Press these buttons to access directly to the corresponding color pages displayed at the lower part of the teletext screen.

Troubleshooting Guide

Troubleshooting

Before contact the service technician, perform the following simple checks. If any program still persists, unplug the TV and calling for serving.

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE SOLUTION
No sound and picture	 Check whether the main plug has been connected to a wall let. Check whether you have pressed the POWER button on the front of TV set. Check the picture contrast and brightness settings.
Normal picture but no sound	 Check the volume. Sound muted? Press the MUTE button. Try another channel, the problem may be with the broadcast. Are the audio cables installed properly?
The remote control does not work	 Check to see if there any object between the product and remote control Causing obstruction. Are batteries installed with correct polarity (+ to +, to -)? Correct remote operating mode set: TV, VCR etc.? Install new batteries.
Power is suddenly turned off	 Is the sleep timer set? Check the power control settings. Power interrupted. No broadcast on station tuned with auto activated.
Picture appears slowly after switching on	This is normal; the image is muted during the product startup process. Please contact your service center, if the picture has not appeared after five minutes.
TV freezes and remote function stop working	 The internet function might cause TV to freeze or stop responding to remote. Unplug your TV from power for at least 1 minute. Plug power back in and turn it on by pressing power button. Please contact your service center if it still doesn't work.
Poor reception , crackling sound or pixelating on screen	- Make sure the antenna cable is plugged in properly. -Rescan the TV channels - Adjust antenna direction to make signal more stronger - Channel good quality antenna cables or socket
HDMI has no picture or sound	Make sure TV is in HDMI mode, press menu then select option menu, go to HDMI EDID setting, change it to ENHANCED if it connect to a 4K device. Otherwise ENHANCED if it connect to a 4K device. Otherwise

Maintenance

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have your new TV. Be sure to turn the power off and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

Cleaning the screen

- 1. Here's a great way to keep the dust off your screen for a while. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry, and then used it to wipe the screen.
- 2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, and then let it air-dry before you turn on your TV.

Cleaning the cabinet

To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth. Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

Extended Absence



If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it's a good idea to unplug the power cord to protect against possible damage from lightning or power surges.

Disposal of old electrical appliances



The European directive 2012/19/EU on Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE), requires that old household electrical appliances must not be disposed of in the normal unsorted municipal waste stream.
